



Sailing Instructors/Educators Full Time Seasonal Positions

For all positions, you must be motivated, able to work within a team as well as on your own and have proven skills working with children. Our team of instructors will work together teaching classes that are either one week, 4 weeks or 8 weeks in duration. **We incorporate STEM education into our curriculum so if you are looking at education as your career this might be a great additional opportunity for you.** You will need to work closely with fellow instructors, NESS support staff, students and interns. You will directly report to the Sailing Program Director. Positions include the following:

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Develop lesson plans based on current curriculum
- Implement both classroom and on the water lessons
- Provide leadership to students and assist in overseeing junior instructors
- Help maintain powerboats and classroom space
- Help implement NESS safety plan and maintain campus and offsite safety at all times

Minimum Requirements:

- US Sailing Level I including current CPR and First Aid
- State Safe boating Certificate
- Lifeguard certification, kayak, SUP and Surf experience all a bonus
- *Racing coaches must have participated in high school or college sailing and have US Sailing Level II Certification
- *18 years of age is preferred*
